

DIRECTIONS

To Brookhaven Deaf Chat From Delaware

I-95 north to exit 5 (first exit past Kerlin Street exit). Follow ramp to 352 which is also *Edgemont Avenue*. Turn left (west) onto Rt. 352. Continue straight (approx. 1.5 miles) past the *Brookhaven Shopping Center*. The first street on the right, after the Wachovia Bank, is *Radio Park Lane*. Turn right. DC-Chat is one-half block on your left. (exit 6 from north I95 and follow 352 north)



DC-CHAT meets directly behind the Shell station on Rt. 352 (Edgemont Ave). Look for the Deaf Christian Church Sign

To Brookhaven Deaf Chat From 476 North

Take exit 1, MacDade Blvd, west into Brookhaven until you come to Rt. 352 (*Edgemont Ave.*). There is a *Sunoco* station on far right corner. Turn right (north) onto Edgemont and follow the directions above from Philadelphia.

To North Philly - Kensington Deaf Chat

From I-95, take the Allegheny. Left at ramp stop sign. Left onto Richmond St. One block, right on Allegheny. Continue for many blocks. Street angles to the left at Kensington Ave., look for streets lettered "F," "E," "D," etc, until you get to "A." The next main street will be "Front." Go one more block to "N. Hope St." Go to the second stop sign and turn right. The K Chat is on the second block on the right. It meets in a row-house with a bright green door and a sign over the entrance that says: "Olinger Youth Center." You can park in the school parking lot at the corner of Hope and Ontario or on the street.

CHAT Zone Schedule

We usually begin the K Chat with dinner, and the DC Chat with drinks, coffee, tea and snacks; chatting together and catching up from the week, playing games, or meeting new people. Then, after approx. 30 to 60 minutes we start discussing a topic life topic, what the Bible has to say to us about it, and how it might apply to our lives.
